Discussion items and key issues:

This was the third conference call of the IA EEC SC.

1. Tom Peterson of CCS called the meeting to order, asked call participants to announce themselves, and reviewed the agenda.
1. Members of the SC reviewed the catalog to make sure that we have not neglected to highlight anything and we merged or split categories for the balloting process
2. The SC members recommended that the following changes be made to the Key to the Future Rankings of Options: High (H) - \$40; Medium (M): \$15-\$40/tCO_{2e}; Low (L): Less than \$15 tCO_{2e}
3. It was recommended by the SC members that the following items be changed on the catalog:

Section 1.

1.1 Now includes reference to the old 5.4 (see below)

The separation in 1.2 of natural gas from propane and fuel oil – the latter 2 are now in a new 1.3

1.6 has been moved to section 7, is now 7.3 and includes reference to relevant provision

1.7 has been deleted because it's redundant with 1.1, 1.2

1.8 has been revised to capture Bob Holmes' language (in this revision, because 1.7 has been deleted, the prior 1.8 is now 1.7 and contains Bob's new language)

New 1.8 inserted to incorporate the former 5.3 into Section 1 (see below)

New 1.9 transferred from 8.1

Section 2.

2.4 has been merged with 2.2

2.5 (= new 2.4) has been changed from M to L for GHG reduction potential

2.8 deleted

2.9 moved to comments

2.10 to 2.12 have been removed and redirected to the cross-cutting SC

Sections 3 and 4 – no changes

Section 5 – eliminated:

5.1 and 5.2 are being moved to the CRE SC

5.3 moved into end of section 1 (now = 1.8)

5.4 removed and referenced in the policy option description document as a component of 1.1

Section 6 – eliminated: both 6.1 and 6.2 moved to CRE SC

Section 5 (formerly 7).

5.1 and 5.2 moved to Cross-cutting SC

5.3 moved to CRE SC

Section 6 (formerly 8).

6.1 incorporated into Section 1

6.2 reference appliances and CFLs

Section 7 (formerly 9) – no change

Section 8 (formerly 10).

8.2 the GHG reduction ranking changed from L to H

8.3. clarifying language that by-product for one industry can be raw material for another rather than being treated as waste.

8.12 Energy District option has been added

Also, the key at the beginning of the document has been revised to reflect the adjusted cost/ton ranges: 0-\$15, \$15 to \$40, and >\$40.

3. Tom explained the next step for the SC: reissue the updated catalog by January 15, 2008 along with a balloting form and guide. SC members identify top 10 are by January 18, 2008; reissue the compilation by January 21, 2008.
