**Discussion items and key issues**

1. Donna Boysen called the meeting to order and took attendance.
2. The draft meeting summary for call #9 was reviewed and approved. There were no comments.
3. Donna provides an overview of the process and expectations of today's call.
4. This is the last call before the June 12 meeting.

5. Randy discussed the draft inventory & forecast for residential, commercial, and industrial sectors.
6. There was a brief discussion regarding where the information came from to develop the inventory. Randy stated that the information is available on the Iowa Climate Change website under “documents and draft reports”.
7. A concern was raised that the spreadsheets available seem very detailed and confusing. An extra meeting was scheduled to explain the spreadsheets on Tuesday, June 2 from 1:00 pm to 2:30 pm central standard time.
8. Randy Craig asked that committee members with additional questions contact him at 919-425-5609.
9. Julia Vetromile discussed with the group EEC spreadsheets 1-14. She began by stating that each spreadsheet contains 4 tabs: (1) a forecast of emissions using a “business as usual” approach (2) emissions with implementation of new policies (3) differences between tabs 1 and 2 and (4) cost.
10. Hal Nelson emphasized that these are draft documents. Numbers put in are only place holders and will not be used in any proceedings; they are merely the first in a series of steps that need to be made. Any concerns the committee has will be incorporated into modifications.
11. The next full council meeting is June 12, 2008. These initial assumptions and preliminary estimates will not have to be discussed in detail at the full council. There is some time to generate numbers that everyone will be comfortable with.
12. Frustration regarding the process was expressed. Hal Nelson will send an Assumptions Memo to clarify what assumptions need to be made for the quantification calculations.
13. Marnie Stein said that it within the rights of the committee to request an in-person meeting. The in-person meeting was requested.
