## Discussion Items

1. Last meeting summary review/approval: the Draft Summary of CC SC Call #11 was approved unanimously with a handful of edits offered by Dr. Stigliani via e-mail.
2. Tom Looby reviewed the results of the last ICCAC meeting and the goals for the next ICCAC meetings on slides # 5-6: He also summarized the results of the Voting Scorecard provided by Marnie Stein: approximately 39 options have been approved, 1 rejected and 16 are still pending.
3. Mr. Looby reviewed slides 11-16 as a foundation for discussing the goal and target setting process in IA. The CC SC will take a first crack at identifying potential GHG Reduction goals and targets for consideration by ICCAC. After the quantification results come in mid- October they will be provided to the CC SC. A question was raised about a possible mistake on slide # 14 regarding the projected reduction figures in the 2012 column. Mr. Looby will check into it and let SC members know the result. He also explained slide 16 which is an example from MN. We will get a similar slide after CCS completes the quantification.

## Discussion of Options

Mr. Looby reported that the ICCAC approved all of the CC SC Policy Options at the last meeting, except CC-2, which will be considered at their next meeting. They made a few suggested minor edits to the Option. Members reviewed the Track Changes version of the POD reflecting ICCAC edits and found them to be an accurate reflection of the changes made at the ICACC Meeting #6.

**CC-2. Statewide GHG Reduction Goals and Targets.** For Option CC-2, which has not yet been approved, a question was offered about whether we are locked into the goal scenarios presented in the Interim Report and repeated on page 7 of the POD? Jerry Schnoor confirmed that the intent was to use these scenarios but that the Council is not prevented from changing them for the final report, if they determine that is appropriate. Jerry Schnoor confirmed that his sense of the Council is that they prefer to present the two scenarios [50% and 90% reductions by 2050] rather than picking a single figure in that range.

**CC-4.2: Ethics and Education** Mr. Looby reported that the Council chose to delete Option 4.2. Mr. Schnoor pointed out that the Council preferred to focus on the educational dimension of the problem, rather than the ethical foundation.

## Next Steps

1. Mr. Looby will check on the reduction numbers in slide # 14 and let the SC know the result.
2. After receiving the quantification tables for the policy options from other SCs the CC SC will strive to formulate a proposed set of GHG Reduction goals prior to the next ICCAC meeting.

3. The next CC Subcommittee call is scheduled for October 22, 2008. A placeholder was also placed on our calendars for another call on October 29 at the same time.
4. The final ICCAC meeting is Nov. 10. The Report is to be completed in mid-December.
